### Permission to Box Abroad Checklist

In order for England Boxing to be able to process your request as quickly as possible please ensure the following is completed before sending.

- 1. Names of boxers and support staff all spelled correctly.
- 2. All Boxers registered and approved on the Vault.
- 3. All Boxers have an in date medical.
- 4. All support staff registered on the Vault.
- 5. Coaches have an in date DBS/safeguarding certificate
- 6. Travel Insurance documents for all travellers (ensure names are spelled correctly)

### Travel Insurance policy must include:

- Medical and Emergency Expenses insurance
- Personal Accident Insurance
- Personal Liability Insurance

Failure to provide all of the above will cause a delay in England Boxing processing your application.

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# ENGLAND BOXING RULES FOR BOXING AGAINST OTHER NATIONALS

#### General

1. Where more than one match takes place each boxer must weigh-in before each contest.

2. A copy of the programme with a report of the results of the tournament shall be submitted to England Boxing within 72 hours of the event.

3. Boxers taking part in these tournaments cannot be described other than as members of their club or Association.

4. Permission can only be granted to Associations or directly affiliated clubs.

#### **Clubs or Associations Boxing Abroad**

1. No Affiliated Association, club or member of an affiliated club may compete or officiate, or travel to compete or officiate, outside the area controlled by the England Boxing without prior sanction of the England Boxing, which must be obtained at least 14 days prior to the tournament. This does not apply to Scotland and Wales where permission is not required.

3. Consent of the England Boxing will be subject to the following conditions:

(a) The inviting Association or Club is a member of an Association affiliated to IBA.

(b) The inviting Association or Club has the approval of its own governing body, which shall be communicated directly to England Boxing.

(c) Where a team is invited, this shall consist of at least one third of the members of the invited

Club.

(d) The match or contest shall not be styled International.

(e) Adequate personal accident insurance for all members of the team has been arranged.

4. The application to the England Boxing must give the following information

- (a) The date and venue of the proposed match or tournament.
- (b) The names and Clubs of all the members included in the party.
- (c) The number of contests arranged for each member of the team.
- (d) The probable duration of the visit.

(e) Details of other personal accident insurance in addition to cover provided by the England Boxing

The England Boxing may, if it so wishes, impose conditions on the travelling club, boxer or official when authorising the application.

5. The application must include the name and signature of the person who is responsible for the matchmaking and the care, welfare and protection of all members of the team.

6. Individual boxers' results must be forwarded to the England Boxing office within 72 hours of the match. Where required, a statement giving full details of the visit with expenses involved and any other information required must be submitted to England Boxing within six weeks of the match or tournament.

7. It is the responsibility of the Team Manager or person in charge to ensure that the boxers BCR1 is marked up in all details. This condition also applies when boxing in Scotland and Wales.

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
